

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The original Off-Broadway production of *Desperate Measures* premiered at the York Theatre in NYC in 2017. The show won the Drama Desk Awards for Outstanding Musical and for Outstanding Lyrics; the Outer Critics Circle Award for Outstanding New Off-Broadway Musical, and the Off Broadway Alliance Award for Best New Musical. It was also nominated for several Lucille Lortel Awards.

The Wild West was dangerous, lawless, and tough, which allows for a thrilling backdrop for this clever spoof of Shakespeare's *Measure for Measure* by Peter Kellogg and David Friedman. The show's themes of love, virtue, mercy, morality, and hypocrisy are as relevant today as they were in Shakespeare's era. *Desperate Measures* is about fighting to stay alive against all odds. It's about seeing injustice in the world and wanting to change it. It asks if there is a right kind of justice and a wrong kind, and whether seeking justice is always...just. Yup, all of this in a humorous, rollicking romp! And in rhymed couplets to boot! The Bard would approve, we reckon!

As Lyricist / Librettist Peter Kellogg wrote:

"It was adapted for your pleasure,
From somethin' called *Measure for Measure*.
I read the piece. Took me a week.
It's nothing like real people speak.
It's what they call a problem play.
I saw the problem right away.
Can't understand half what they say.

So we fixed up the words a lot, Plus we threw out half the plot: The storyline was too complex. But we kept all the parts with...sex. So if that offends unduly, Blame Will Shakespeare, not yours truly."
